

The Spokane Flour Mill is a magnificent turn-of-the-century historic site on the north bank of the Spokane River in downtown Spokane.

Built in 1895, it was among the many buildings designed to utilize the power of the mighty Spokane River in the early part of the 20th century.

After its long and controversial history as a Flour Mill, it achieved further greatness in the mid-1970's, when it was designated as an historic site. Its unique architecture was preserved as it underwent a complete transformation.



The Flour Mill was redesigned into a retail shopping site for Expo '74, which took place just one block from The Mill. By the time this event opened, the historic mill housed dozens of locally owned businesses and eateries and had become an official Spokane destination place. The three floors above the retail shops were transformed into an office complex. Since that time, this beautiful historic building has remained a delightful source of unique dining and wonderful shopping.
